## A. Resolution to add new Director of Financial Services, Craig Bailey as a signer

When we updated this resolution in June we did not know that in order for Craig Bailey to have online access to the EC BOCES bank accounts we needed to have him as a signer of checks and notes. This resolution adds Craig, although, we do not have any intention of having him actually sign any check or notes. He will be able to remotely access our accounts to verify that bills have been accurately paid and that payroll has been dispersed. He will also be able to get real time and monthly account statements more quickly.

We unfortunately will have to get signatures on this document again, so we will be asking Janet Kravig, Doug Vondy and Nancy Barden to sign again.

#### VII. Discussion Items –

### A. Discussion of Services Provided by EC BOCES to Member Districts

#### a. Megan Donnellon - Impact Teams

Impact Teams are TEAMS of educators who PARTNER with students. They INNOVATE to expand STUDENT OWENERSHIP. They SCALE UP their collective expertise to MAKE A DIFFERENCE for ALL students.

The BOCES has been working with the Core Collaborative since the summer of 2013 to help implement the Impact Teams Model in the districts.

Impact Teams started with 5 model school within our BOCES and now we have 17 schools that are participating in this initiative. In the past, the BOCES has provided Impact Team coaches to work with teams of teachers out in the districts. This year, we are changing the model to build from within the district. The districts have the option to designate a coordinator for each building to work with an Impact Team Coach and that the information back to the districts. We currently have 22 coordinators. These coordinators will be receiving a stipend from Title II funds. We feel this is the best model because the money is getting put back into the districts.

Districts that have not selected a coordinator will continue to have an Impact Team Coach provided by the BOCES.

This year we are excited that we will be able to provide English Language hours through the Impact Team Model. We will be working with Rachel Fairchild who is a consultant with the Core Collaborative who has experience with Impact Teams and offers English Language PD. We will be working with her throughout the school year to support the local coordinators and be able to address EL concerns during Impact Team meetings to provide hours that teachers need with the new state mandate of 45 hours.

Impact Teams are currently happening in Colorado, Texas, California, New York, Hawaii, Missouri, Illinois, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Nevada, Utah, South Carolina, and are now starting to move internationally. The BOCES is grateful to have the opportunity to incorporate this work into our districts and be part of a model that focuses on student growth for ALL students. The BOCES has helped develop this model that is being implemented across the country.

## b. Moira Hawks and Beverly Blagg – Special Education
